

# FISH CLUB MEETING

### C. Lawn Fertilizers

Mike mentioned that he is working on the fertilizer problem that might be harmful to the lake.

A. brief liaison report was given to the membership. Basically, it brought to the attention of the Association what the Fish Club had done in regards to shocking and stocking.

Before adjourning the meeting, Wally wanted to clear up any questions regarding the total number of pan fish caught at one time. You are allowed 25 crappie and 25 bluegill. As far as fishing for bass and walleye, they are not moving now.
