

FISH CLUB MEETING
OCTOBER 7, 2004

Treasurers report:

At this time we have \$6027.96 in the account.

Liaison:

No report. It should be noted that at this time that the membership present agreed that a Board liaison need no longer attend, as we are no longer a committee, but have now become a club. As proposed at the August meeting, the individuals holding the offices of chairman, vice-chairman, treasurer and secretary will be considered a committee and will make decisions with the clubs understanding. Old business:

Fish shocking took place September 8th. Discussion followed in regards to our large population of catfish and apparent increases of walleye. Largemouth bass are lacking two year classes, as are bluegills. It should be noted that the actual biologist report will be forthcoming at the end of the year.

Chairman Harper stated that he has not yet contacted the source for the cinder blocks, but will do so soon.

New business:

Chairman stated concerns regarding exotic species of vegetation entering the lake, such as purple loosestrife, which could cause possible problems. Also mentioned was the article regarding the spoils area, (west end) and how this should help maintain protection to the lake.

It was also discussed that our meeting dates are sometimes omitted in the L.S.News. Chairman Harper will investigate. Also discussed was the boat patrol's misunderstanding of proper rules regarding guests fishing and this also will be investigated.
